


hotel for the Royal Bayreuth rate for any added dates.

We have received from our members some wonderful entries into our auction.


Now most members want THE LIST of what is being offered, and we will make that available mid September, as many of you have promised that you will firm up your decision on what to auction as we get closer to the convention date.


