Notes From The Secretary - By Judith White



Note From Our Historian:



We received this letter from Jim Davis's Wife and Son. I know many of you also received the same letter, but I felt it should be included in this Newsletter for all our members to read.

I would like everyone to know how appreciative we are for all the support, gracious words and helping hands that we received. We cannot express enough how grateful we are to all of you.

As it is often said, you definitely find out who your true friends are during difficult times. All of our family and friends have been so supportive. My father in short, was a class act. I have always been a firm believer that you have a little bit of all your fellow friends and family within you. My father was a prime example; he loved his family and friends dearly. Between postcards, Royal Bayreuth, all his friends and family, his character, sense of humor, wisdom and love was generated from all of us. Not only had everyone influenced him into becoming a terrific father but also into my best friend. I don't even have to say that I hope a little bit of

him will carry on among all of us because I'm sure it will. He just had that affect on people.

Many of you have been wondering what was his cause of death. My father had heart disease. The medical term for this was cardiac arrhythmia associated with ischemic heart disease. It was explained to me that he had an irregular heart beat which in turn resulted to an insufficient flow of blood throughout his body. This caused a heart attack or his heart to skip a beat and it never recovered from stopping. He never knew he had such a disease, nor did any of us for that matter. It has been very frustrating because it is very easily treated by medication.

Many of you knew either my mother, myself or both of us. Due to recent health problems of her own, she is moving to Maryland with me, into a new house that I just purchased. She will be leaving Johnstown at the end of April and visiting her sister for a few weeks in Rochester, New York. After I have moved all of her belongings to Maryland, she will then move in about the middle of May. I have enclosed our new address and phone numbers. You are all welcome to call or

visit any time. I shared many stories from meeting you, which have made things somewhat easier. I would enjoy sharing some of my own stories with you, and I look forward to hearing from you.

My father passed on many great things to all of us. I'm sure he would love to see us sharing it along with others whom we love as much as he loved us. Again, my mother and I are forever grateful and wish each of you the very best that life has to offer.




