Our programs are ready with an event schedule similar to the 1999 convention. We hope you will be with us and enjoy the 'good times'.






The Royal Bayreuth Ping Pong Designs



In this article I would like to introduce myself as a new member and introduce the RBCC membership to some little known Royal Bayreuth porcelain that has become my passion.

My collection focuses on vintage Table Tennis, a game which invaded dining rooms around the turn of the century with unprecedented fervor. I was astonished to discover that Royal Bayreuth produced a series of porcelains with 3 different Table Tennis or Ping Pong designs. These all bear the familiar blue mark with the "T" and standing lions.



As shown above, the 3 patterns include American flag motifs, in the ribbons or above the table, a clear indication that these sets were made for the American market. I would be most interested in any further details that members can provide, especially dates of manufacture.

Illustrated below are some of the pieces which are in my collection (bottom row) or known to exist (thanks to Judy Stockwell).

These include:
Pitcher/creamer (made in all 3 patterns), sugar bowl with 3 handles, tea cup, demitasse, juice glass, a square irregular surface ashtray plate and a dice



shaped toothpick. In Columbus Mary McCaslin was very kind to share her gorgeous wall pocket with me (flags over table design). I couldn't help feeling weak in the knees when I held it!

As it is so difficult for me to make progress in such a specialized area I am appealing to the membership for help. If any general RB collectors can spare pieces of the ping Pong porcelain I shall be eternally grateful! All contacts welcomed!

Please remember, everyone's help is needed to make this a great newsletter. Articles are always accepted and greatly appreciated.



Your Editor, Alma Biddlecome Each of us has a white porcelain clog with a blue pattern. The patterns are identical to each other and have all the design elements of Royal Bayreuth's *Old Tettau Blue* pattern. Judy first noticed this and brought it to Anne's attention. Sketches of the shoe and its pattern are shown below.



Note the asymmetrical vine on the vamp, with the right-angle turn on the right side of the shoe, the "peace" symbols, and the ray patterns along the bottom edge of the shoe. The shoes share these and other similarities to *Old Tettau Blue*.

While Judy's shoe is unmarked, Anne's has an underglaze blue mark, as shown. We have been unable to find a RB Old Tettau Blue piece with exactly this mark, although many carry a mark with similar characteristics. If you have any RB Old Tettau Blue pieces, would you check the marks and let us know if you find a match. Or, if you can find this mark attributed to another manufacturer, kindly

let us know. We have searched our books on marks with no success.

We know that once a china pattern has become popular, it often has been copied. For example, Meissen's Onion Pattern is one of the best known designs; it has been copied by more than sixty European and Oriental factories. [Meissen itself probably did not originate the pattern. It is believed to have adapted its *Onion Pattern* from a Chinese flat bowl of the K'ang Hsi Period (1662-1722)]

An asymmetrical vine pattern similar to Old Tettau Blue can be found on the products of other factories. The version used by Villeroy & Boch is distinguishable because the leaves on the vine are replaced by a series of small dots and portions of the vine are significantly different. In the "Copenhagen Pattern ", the version used by the English firm of Dunn Bennett & Co., the leaves are shaped like real leaves while those on Old Tettau Blue are stylistic and typically are filled, elongated ovals. In place of the "peace" symbols, the "Copenhagen Pattern" has irregular cells with a tiny leaf pattern.

Does anyone know whether the same design elements found in *Old Tettau Blue* can be found on the products of any other factory?

We hope that you can help us to solve the mystery of the origin of this shoe with what appears to be Royal Bayreuth's *Old Tettau Blue* pattern on it.

On October 30, 1999, Thomaston Place Auction Gallery featured the first session of an excellent two-day auction. The gallery, located on US Route One in Thomaston, Maine, was standing room only as collectors, dealers and retail buyers competed for quality items.

Auctioneer Kaja Veilleux and his able staff had assembled a wide range of quality New England furniture, early English oak pieces and an array of estate Oriental rugs. Also offered was a mix of early baskets, fabric, ceramics, fine art and a small but select grouping of Tiffany items.

The focus of this article is the afternoon session which brought to the auction block of a private, single family collection of Royal Bayreuth offered unreserved. Assembled over a period of many years, the Bayreuth was purchased mainly from area homes. Located about an hour from my hometown, the owners seldom bought from other dealers and hence, the collection was previously unknown to me.

My general observations were that hand-painted ivory items brought less in New England than elsewhere, rare figurals were strong and it was interesting to see strong interest in tapestry. Nearly every tapestry piece had absentee and phone bids with strong bidding from the floor in all categories as well.

Please note that prices reported do not include a 10%

premium.

2001 Trip To Europe & Letter To Editor

Hello RB Coflectors,

We are in the process of putting together a Ground Tour of Eastern Germany in August of the year 2001. We hope to see the sights in Berlin, Dresden, Tettau, and the Munich area, where the castles of King Ludwig are located, and other factories such as The Hummel factory, etc.

Leaving the U.S.A. from Chicago or Pittsburg and landing in Berlin, Germany spending at least 2 nights in Berlin; City tour and visiting Potsdam, and then on to Meissen-Dresden area and tour the Meissen Porcelain Factory: Travel into the beautiful Thuringia Area (through what was East Germany), and staying at Ludwigstadt or Coburg with 2 days to visit the Royal Bayreuth Factory at Tettau, another porcelain factory in Tettau, and the Hummel Plant near Coburg. These tours are very interesting adding knowledge about the process used in making porcelain products. We might even get to visit one of the three porcelain figurine factories owned by the Bayreuth factory which is located not far from Tettau in (East Germany). Leaving this area, we will head for Munich in beautiful Bavaria, staying 3 or 4 nights in that area. Places

of interest are Dachau, King Ludwig's 4 beautiful castles: Then into the Salzburg, Austria area to visit Hitler's famed "Eagles Nest" at Oberammergau: also in the foothills of the Alps, we will enjoy the tour of the "Swartzki" Crystal Factory.

In 1998, we took a group of R.S. Prussia Collectors through Central Europe for 14 days, seeing these attractions and others. The cost then was \$2350 per person which included Germany, Western Poland, Prague, Vienna, and ending up in Zurich, Switzerland. This price included air fare, hotels, all traveling by good bus, and 13 or more meals.

We hope that at least 36 Royal Bayreuth Collectors might find the time to join us and spend 10-12 days and have a relaxed, fun time!

General Auction Terms & Conditions

Auction to be held at the annual Royal Bayreuth Collectors Club convention.

Auction is a private function and open to all financial members of the Royal Bayreuth Collectors Club members.

All items to be consigned through Royal Bayreuth Collectors Club Auction Committee.

Number of items to be auctioned will be determined by the Auction Chairperson and the Club President.

The final date for acceptance of auction consignments will be July 31st.

Reserves are accepted on any item offered for consignment at the sellers discretion. There will be a \$10.00 handling fee on any item that does not meet the sellers reserve, and if the seller is not in attendance at the auction the item will be returned at the sellers expense.

Commission will be charged to the seller on all successful sales at 8% with a maximum ceiling of \$150.00 per item.

There is no buyers fee.

Reserve bids and absentee bids will be handled by the auction committee. At no time will the auction committee divulge any sellers reserve or offers made by absentee bidders. All absentee bids must be in writing prior to the auction. Phone bids are unacceptable. No absentee bids will be exercised on any item deemed to be imperfect.

The auction committee reserves the right to accept or reject any item to balance the content of the auction. All due care will be exercised when handling consigned items at the convention auction. The Royal Bayreuth Collectors Club and Auction Committee cannot be held responsible for damage on any item in its care. It is the sellers responsibility to arrange their own insurance.

Prices realized at the auction will be published in the December newsletter. This information is for members only and is not available to nonmembers or the press.

Participation is offered to all members whether attending the convention or not. Absentee bids are treated in strictest confidence and will be bid for you as if you were attending personally. Bids will be raised in reasonable increments according to the value of the item.

These rules are recommended for RBCC board approval by President Bob McCaslin and Auction Chairman Paul Toland.


