I know you will be pleased to own a special 2000 Convention mug. The Tettau factory was kind enough to do this for us, and have done a super job. It has a very special mark on it, just for our Club. Imagine having a porcelain mug made at the same factory your own Royal Bayreuth was produced. It is a Limited Edition of 350. (Our expense in getting

the mug is as follows: The factory cost per mug is \$8.50 (U.S.) plus shipping, and customs, etc.) Each family membership that attends the Convention will be given a mug as a gift from the club. You may buy more if you wish at that time. The price will be \$10.00 per mug (due to the shipping expenses from Germany). They will be offered at the Convention in

Indy and then sent to members at home as long as they last (plus \$3.00 mailing expense). I have received a tentative number of 234 mugs requested from my last inquiry.

The factory was so very cooperative over the last year with making this possible. Enjoy!!

Just pause a moment, and recall how many miles each of us will drive to a show or auction, in hopes of seeing 30-50 RB items for sale. This fine example (hanging match-holder or wall pocket) of a Royal Bayreuth "Sport Piece" portrays the ever popular game of table tennis. We will have a very informative and exciting program on this subject at our 2000 Royal Bayreuth Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana, by a very knowledgeable collector in the table tennis field, Mr. Charles Hoey of Elizabeth, Pennsylvania.



Royal Bayreuth has many outstanding bowls, floral, scenic, and portrait. This bowl is a medallion with four beautiful ladies....Muff Lady, and Lady with Horse.... displayed on a satin-finish floral (daisy) background. A wonderful addition to any collection. The "Sterling Silver" Shoe is a rarity to be proud of, and is a fine example of both the unusual coloring and the shoe mold that we see in other patterns (both are marked).

Unmarked Royal Bayreuth?

Excuse the white spots on the elephant. They are caused by our flash. The elephant is totally black, with white tusks. It does have the feel, and coloring of Royal Bayreuth. Come see. We will be showing it plus others for "Show & Tell" in our room at the convention. Also, we just recently bought a small collection of Royal Bayreuth Figurals, Tapestry, Nursery Rhymes, Miniature's and Scenics that we will be selling in our convention room this year.

This beautiful Royal Bayreuth vase can be found in various shapes and sizes (4" to 11½"). This pattern is also found in a very impressive salad bowl (silver rim) and matching serving spoon and fork (silvered in England, as many RB vases were); and a cookie jar or biscuit jar with a silver, handled lid (also silvered in England). Through a lot of researching, the birds are identified as "The Princess Stephanie Bird of Paradise (with the long, ribbon tail) and a Parrot, both found in the Australian Realm. The Bird of Paradise was also found in an "old" pattern book owned by the Tettau Factory (early 1900's).


Royal Bayreuth - A Collector's Guide - Book II - by Mary McCaslin

"2001 Trip To Germany!"

You are invited!! Join us for a fantastic tour of Central Europe, where Porcelain abounds. Travel with your own special group of Porcelain lovers. The great part of having your own group is that if there is a special place you want to visit, as long as the group agrees, you can do it!

Leave the USA on August 1, 2001. Your tour begins in Berlin, where you will be met by your escort for the next 14 days. Spend three nights in Berlin. Visit the Pergamon Museum; see the sights of Berlin including where "the Wall" once stood. Then it's off to Dresden via Potsdam. Stops include a guided tour of the Sanssouci Palace.

Your Porcelain journey begins with the Meissen Porcelain Factory. While in the area you will visit the Oldmasters Art Gallery, the Green Vault, and the Alberinum House.

Then off to Prague, with a stop at the Duchov Porcelain Factory. Dinner tonight will be a special treat. Enjoy the folk music and entertainment, while dining. Next morning you will visit the Prague Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral, and the Old Royal Palace.

From Prague you will make your way to Ludwigsstadt, stopping at the Hummel Porcelain Factory and two Royal Bayreuth factories. Here you will be able to view the production and visit the sales room in Tettau.

Then off to Munich via Nuremberg. A half-day sightseeing is included in both Nuremberg and Munich.

From Munich, you will spend a day visiting the Newschwanstein Castle and Oberammegau. See the famous castle that inspired Disney's very own Cinderella castle. Revel in the history of the Passion Play at Oberammegau. Visit the Eagles Nest and King Ludwig's other two castles as well.

From Munich your travels will take you to Salzburg, where you will visit Mozart's house and the Swarovski crystal factory.

Your farewells will be said in Munich, as the group returns home.

Tour includes accommodations for 14 nights, 13 breakfasts, eight regular dinners and two special dinners, services of your own private motorcoach, with English speaking guide, and much more.
