Not just anyone can mail by bulk mail. You must have a bulk mail permit which has an initial application fee plus an annual fee. My company has had a permit for many, many years and the club will be using my bulk mail permit at no cost. Mail houses and printing services usually charge for this service. The club could apply for a non-profit mailing permit at some time allowing even deeper discounts. but this too has an annual fee along with the initial application fee. Sometimes the fees cost more than the actual savings.

The convention entertainment, "The Little People" were such a unique form of entertainment! As you can see, it is with a



little reluctance that I allow this little guy to plant a kiss on my cheek! We certainly got a lot of laughs out of their show.

Much time was donated by the Andersons and Thackers in preparing the room for our attendees.






