#### **Silent Auction Rules**

- 1. Bidders must be current club members.
- 2. Auction pieces will be described in the current newsletter. A blast email will be sent to all club members who have an email address.
- 3. Snail mail and e-mail bids are accepted but must be received by the Auction Chair prior to the close of auction date that is published in the newsletter.
- 4. All auction items are offered on an "as is" basis. Any damage or issues with any specific piece will be noted in the auction description. If something in the description is missed, the Auction Chair will void the auction.
- 5. The Auction Chair has final approval of all pieces in the auction.
- 6. In the event of a dispute, the judgment of the Auction Chair is final
- 7. There are no buyer's premiums for items in the auction.
- 8. A minimum bid price will be established for each piece in the auction.
- 9. Bidders should submit their maximum bids to the Auction Chair before the closing date that is published in the newsletter. Minimum bid increments will be \$5 when the auction bid is under \$100 and \$10 when the auction bid is over \$100. (For example, if the starting bid on a specific piece is \$25 and member A sends in a max bid of \$50 and member B sends in a max bid of \$100 and the bid increments are \$5, then member B would win the piece at \$55).
- 10. In case of a high bid tie, the first high bid received by the Auction Chair will be declared the winner
- 11. High bidder agrees to pay the winning bid price and the cost of insuring and shipping the winning piece(s) unless alternate arrangements have been made. Auction Chair will notify winner of the total cost within one week after the close of the auction. Payments by check should be made out to "RBCC"
- 12. All auction sales are final.

## Spreading the Word

On October 20, 2012 Terry and I did a Royal Bayreuth presentation for the 20's-30's-40's glassware club of Northern Illinois. Our friend Ken Pakula asked if we would speak to his group.

They meet every other month on Saturday for potluck along with programs, lotteries, etc. Knowing they each set their own table with special glassware, we brought our table setting of Royal Bayreuth blue onion plates, cups, etc.

We took items from most categories listed in Mary's first book with the exception of Santa Claus, Red Devil, and Sunbonnet Babies. (We don't own any of those pieces.) We included pieces that would be familiar to many people like tomato and lobster pieces. We also included pieces that were probably not as familiar to most. We also displayed satin grapes pitchers in





3 sizes which showed the difference in sizes. We showed several tapestry pieces, and of course some RB shoes.

We started our talk describing why we were attracted to R.B. (devil & cards) and how it grew from there. We gave a little historic background of the company and also explained that we didn't have a lot of info regarding the company because fires/destroyed paperwork, etc.

Terry gave a good description of how the tapestry pieces were made.

People were very interested. They took lots of photos and asked questions. One man even brought a piece of R.B. that he had just purchased at a consignment store for



\$2.00. He noticed the unusual mark, which said Royal Banreuth, instead of Bayreuth. We had several books with us and were able to show him that exact mark in the book. That also led us to discussing the different marks throughout the years.

We enjoyed talking about R.B. and showing many pieces. So, if you have a church group or antique collectors group in your area, you might consider doing a presentation of R.B. You never know, you may gain a new collector for our club.
