

Auction 2015 Planning

Planning is underway for the 2015
Convention Auction in Cleveland,
Friday September 25. Although we've
barely unpacked and are still weary
from the 2014 convention, it's time to
start planning for the annual auction
in Cleveland next September. As you
all know, one of the goals of the Club
is to help members dispose of their
collections when the member makes
the very difficult decision to downsize
or because the children, spouse or
family members don't want the
collection.

We know from experience (and recent auctions), that when a collector consigns a large collection to an auction house, the rare pieces still command a good selling price but the more common pieces may go at bargain prices. However, when a collector has multiples of rare pieces, the pieces may not bring as much when sold all together in the same auction. In addition, there are significant auction fees to pay and no reserves allowed.

This is one of the reasons we suggest to collectors that if they are

willing to sell their collection off in smaller lots over a period of a few years, they may get more for the pieces rather than if the collection is sold in one large auction. The Club has one collector who has consigned 25-35 pieces a year for several years and thus has been able to continue to "enjoy her children" by letting just a few pieces go each year.

So this is my suggestion to you. If you are thinking of downsizing or disposing your collection, or if you are concerned with "burdening" your children or survivors with your collection, if you are moving to a smaller house or just tired of dusting all those pieces, then give me a call. I do not pressure people into downsizing but perhaps my experience with others can help you.

Remember, there are no fees to sell through the Club. You get to put whatever reserve you want on your pieces. Please give me a call when you want to discuss your options.

RBCC Board of Directors Meeting - Thursday, October 16, 2014 4:00 pm

Mary Anderson opened the meeting acknowledging that the RBCC has been in existence for 20 years with this being the 20th convention. The first convention took place in Schaumburg, IL in 1994.

Steve Bartlett gave an auction report mentioning that there were 40-45 pieces from the Wenger collection in the silent auction, the sale of which has subsidized recent convention expenses. The evening live auction has many nice pieces, 75 of which are from the Wenger collection with no reserves. Steve currently has 4 or 5 contacts that are willing to submit 20-30 pieces each year for the auction. The treasury is in good shape with income from the other silent auctions during the year. Five Golden Tickets will once again be drawn to be used at the Friday night auction. Each will be worth \$100/one per membership.

Chris Bartlett reported that the club has 122 memberships with 7 being new members, and 36 attendees at this convention. Most of the new members have been gained through the club website where a membership form is available. The dues structure will remain the same, \$30 for one year and \$55 for 2 years.

Jay Rublaitus reported that Wib Beachy was willing to be the new president but there was still a need for a vice-president and another board member as Mary McCaslin is ending her term. There continues to be a great need for willing participants to be club officers and board members. There was some discussion about allowing the president to select other officers to make a working team and Wib Beachy would be consulted before any decision would be made.

A motion was made to list past officers and board members in the membership roster with the years served as a reference. Motion passed.

Mary will ask for volunteers to audit the treasurer's books at the Friday Welcome meeting. There continues to be a need for a volunteer historian.

Motion made and passed to pay the hotel expenses for the newsletter Editor and the club Web Master.

Motion made and passed to pay

the hotel expenses for the auctioneer.

Mary Anderson announced that arrangements have been made for a Haviland Museum tour in downtown St. Charles starting at 11am.

Transportation will be made by hotel shuttle starting at 10:30am following the welcome meeting. The closing time for the silent auction will be changed to 1PM.

Terry Anderson gave a review of the questionnaire mailed in a newsletter. Thirty-six memberships responded indicating a preference of a convention the first two weeks of October or the last two weeks of September, a Midwest state of PA, IN or IL and a strong interest in local attractions. He also reported on his findings on future conventions sites.

Jay Rublaitus presented a very well prepared binder of five possible future convention sites. His research included: Cleveland, Ohio; Columbus, Ohio; Charlotte, North Carolina; Schaumburg, Illinois; and East Peoria, Illinois. A motion was made and passed to recommend Cleveland, Ohio as next years' convention site with a second choice to be made at the business meeting for future consideration.

New Officers: Wib Beachy has agreed to be President. Paul Stratman then volunteered to be Vice President and Jim Carter added to the board. Harriet Lavine has agreed to serve a second term on the board. Roberta Cappel agreed to another year as Historian and Janet Belcher continues on and on and on as recording secretary.

RBCC Survey Results: Terry Anderson presented survey results from the questionnaire sent out earlier in the year. There were 36 responses with the greatest interest for future conventions to be in the PA, IN or IL areas with the first two weeks of October & last two weeks of September being most requested. The option of including local attractions was highly popular. Roster: It was suggested by the board that the names of past officers and board members and the dates they served, be added to the pages of the membership roster. This action was well received by the attendees.

Editor Report: There continues to be a need to help the editor with articles, news and collecting tidbits.

Auction Report: Steve Bartlett stated that the auction report is incomplete at this time but the low prices are discouraging.

Website Report: Gregg Thacker reported that the site is going strong with 40 different visitors to the site daily. New memberships have been gained through the website. The yearly fees are \$125 to host and \$12 for name ownership. All historic scrapbooks have been scanned and are archived. They will be on the website for members only which may increase the host fee due to the increased space needed. Facebook is active but needs more personal involvement in order to promote the club.

Round Table Discussion: There was a short discussion on the future of the club with an emphasis on promoting the club, marketing and Facebook involvement to interest younger members.

Hospitality Room: Roberta & Alvin Cappel volunteered to host the hospitality room at the next convention in Cleveland, Ohio.

Wib Beachy opened the meeting by welcoming new board members Paul Stratman and Jim Carter. The future convention sites of Cleveland, Ohio for 2015 and East Peoria, IL tentatively for 2016 will be contacted of the club decision and a contract will be negotiated and signed by the president.

Wib opened a discussion on ways to improve the membership. Chris Bartlett stated that she makes personal calls to all members not renewing their membership inquiring about reasons for not rejoining.
