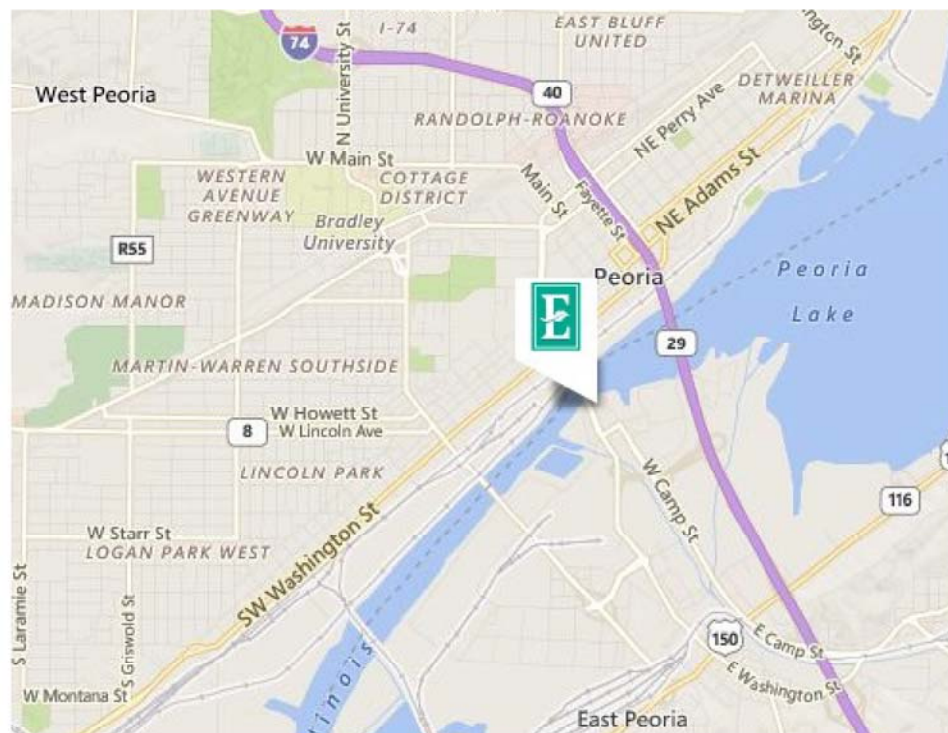

One feature among the 8000+ Jugs in the Museum is a collection of about 250 Royal Bayreuth character pitchers. With a few exceptions, the collection includes complete sets in all sizes of virtually all of the Royal Bayreuth characters.

The Museum is open Wednesday, Friday and the 1st and 3rd Saturday, 10am-5pm, and Thursday 11am-7pm, or by appointment. We will soon be arriving in East Peoria for our 2016 RBCC Convention. Any member who is unable to attend the convention can bid through an absentee bid process. There are a couple of ways to enter your bid if you can't join us for the auction.

You can have a member who is attending bid for you or you can have a member of the auction committee handle your bidding. If you want the auction committee to bid, you need to have your maximum bids into me in writing by Sunday, September 18. You can send your bids to my home address.

If you are the high bidder on any item(s), you agree to pay any shipping, insurance and packing fee, in addition to the cost of your winning bid. I will notify you of the exact costs within one-two weeks after the close of the auction.

There is no buyer's premium or buyer/seller fees for items consigned or purchased through the Club auction.

We always attempt to accurately describe each piece in our Club auction. If any damage is found

before a piece is auctioned that was not previously described, we will either pull the piece or not accept any absentee bidders who are not fully aware of the damage. The Club offers no warranties and all items are sold "as is" with no returns.

We hope to see you in East Peoria, but if you can't make it, please send in your absentee bids! Where else can you buy something for nodding? But, you have to stay till the bidder end!

We are looking forward to seeing all of you in September in East Peoria.
