#### Museum Collection Includes RB

Earlier this year the University of Tennessee at Knoxville published a summary of one of their decorative collections called The Hensley Pitchers: A Legacy of Southern Sisters. The document is over 250 pages and available at this link: http://www.royalbayreuth.org/UTK\_Museum\_2017.pdf Due to the size of that file, it would be best to download a copy to your computer (which may take a few minutes) then peruse the file at your leisure.

Author Donna McCarthy (Collections Assistant at the UTK McClung Museum) did an excellent job of summarizing the collection and its history. You will see some familiar RB pieces, and a few unusual pieces (I had not seen the unmarked opossum & baby before – which is shown on page 188).

The report includes pieces from many other makers of decorative items in the late 1800's – including Schaefer

and Vater. There is a fascinating history of collecting these items accompanied by related newspaper stories (and pictures!). On page 4 there is a photo that looks to be 100 years old showing of one of the sisters surrounded by some of the collection. If you zoom in on that photo you can see what appears to be several RB pieces amongst the collection!

Apparently the entire collection is not on view, but the museum selects and displays a few pieces on a rotating basis. There may well be more RB history hiding here! 
#### Calling all RB Horse Owners!

#### Tettau Antiquariant

For the past 25 years I have enjoyed collecting the traditional scenic and figural Royal Bayreuth pieces we have all come to know. Recently, however, I have begun to pick up pieces manufactured by the Factory in the not-too-distant past. They are briefly mentioned in Mary's Books. They are known as the Tettau Antiquariat Series.

While all of the original figural molds were destroyed by fire before and shortly after the start of World War I, the Factory in the 1980's decided to reissue certain figural relief pieces by reproducing molds for them. However, rather than extensively painting them in the full range of colors with several finishes used for the earlier pieces, the Factory assigned the Series a basic white color with faint muted highlights of a greenish yellow (if any at all) and a glossy finish. The porcelain for this Series has a different "feel" from traditional RB. It is lighter to the touch.

The figural pieces I've seen for this Series include the Art Nouveau Lady dresser tray, the bottom half of the Pansy cracker jar/humidor (which is a vase), a grape relief bowl, a pansy (titled Anemone) water pitcher, and shell plates. I've discovered an Art Nouveau Lady large serving platter in



two color variations. It is part of the Daphne Collection for this Series and is quite striking in appearance.

Apparently, the Factory wanted to break out of its dinnerware format in briefly producing this Series as well as some other limited figural pieces. However, it soon returned to its prevailing dinnerware format exclusively. I believe this was likely the result of the difficulty with attendant cost in reproducing the original molds.

I have no doubt that with passing time, this Series and the other limited figural pieces the Factory produced as "later generation" will generate their own attraction among RB collectors. This is especially so because of the reduced prices for which the same can be bought. Most can be acquired in the \$50 - \$100 range. A member should consider adding them now to an advanced collection before that changes as it did with the "older generation" pieces. History does have a way of repeating itself.
