

As I told you in the last newsletter, I'll be making a presentation with Jim and Susan on what the Tettau factory produced from the end of WWI to the start of WWII — the so-called "Lost Years." The wares produced during that period were artistically incredible! They are among the best Art Deco and Art Nouveau pieces I've seen in more than 50 years of collecting antiques. If you are able to attend, please



do so. I guarantee you will not be disappointed.

Pieces in the Club Auction will be listed and published in advance as usual. If you have pieces you wish to sell outside the Club Auction, tables are available at \$25 each. They will be in the meeting room throughout the Convention. There will also be a Chinese Auction for pieces donated to the Club on separate tables in the same room.

Another Source of RB Pricing

Did you know you can easily see the selling price of Royal Bayreuth sold on Live Auctioneers? This data provides an interesting and useful reference. You would need an account at Live Auctioneers (which is free) and to login to their site. Then the process is:

- 1) Click on "Price Results" in the upper left corner of their web page
- 2) Enter search terms in the window such as Royal Bayreuth Stork
- 3) See results and arrange by date or price

Whether you're a collector wanting to know what price to pay; a consignor looking to learn the value of your property; an appraiser or estate office trying to evaluate a client's possessions; or a journalist researching a given subject, our database is a valuable tool.

You could see many years worth of RB sales by simply entering Royal Bayreuth in the search box. Or enter a description such as Stork or Devil to see all manner of collectibles!
